aim is to assist students living in Northern Alberta to cover costs for post-secondary studies and any related practicums they may have. It includes:

• NADC bursary – for final 2 years of studies, up to \$12 000

• FNMI bursary – for FNMI studies who are willing to return to work in Northern Alberta after their studies are complete, up to \$10 000

• Medical/Dentistry bursary – for students in Medical/Dental programs who are willing to return to work in Northern Alberta after their studies are complete, up to \$12 000

• Pharmacy bursary – for students in Pharmacy programs who are willing to return to work in Northern Alberta after their studies are complete, up to \$12 000
