

The Big Idea:



<u>AI technologies pose both great challenges and tremendous</u> <u>opportunities related to student growth.</u>



Opening Thoughts

The artificial intelligence in our devices is changing our present-day lives. These technologies are embedded in our internet search engines, our entertainment, and in various forms of art. We have concerns about AI in the school setting, but we also recognize these new technologies present opportunities as well.

As educators, what are some of our concerns about AI?

- 1.If students misuse AI, they will miss out on opportunities to develop core skills such as literacy, critical thinking, and problem-solving.
- 2.It is an issue of academic integrity if students misrepresent AI-produced material (in whole or in part) as their original work.
- 3.In what ways can we teach students to use these technologies positively?

What are some common examples of AI tools?

- 1. ChatGPT (click the link) is probably the most famous. If you have not tried this software yet, I would encourage you to type an essay topic into this program. You will be amazed with what it can produce, almost instantly.
- 2. <u>Grammarly</u> is designed as a tool to enhance writing and identify errors in writing. This tool is more "educational" in the traditional sense as it can help students learn how to improve their existing work. However, students do not have access to tools like Grammarly when writing formal essays for Social Studies and English.

What are some potential opportunities for AI in education?

- 1.Students who understand and use AI effectively will be better prepared for employment and entrepreneurship. Future career choices will be shaped by AI technologies.
- 2.Teachers will have access to new tools to improve student engagement and perhaps even new strategies to provide feedback and individualized materials for learners.

Where do we stand right now?

- 1.We expect that students will only use AI tools in collaboration with their teachers.
- 2. Teachers have tools to assess if student work contains AI assistance.
- a.If a student's work contains significant unexpected AI assistance parents will be contacted and students will be expected to re-do their assignment.
- 3.Our English, Social Studies, and French Language Arts teachers can access a locked browser for formal essays and exams including our written final exams. Our teachers are also working to integrate secure writing browsers into their classroom work and exams.


Conclusion

GRADE 9 HEALTH




CEREMONY
