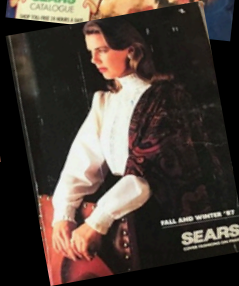
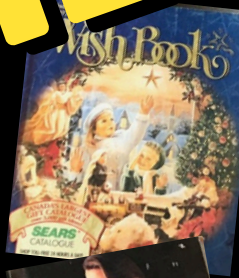
If you have student going into Grade 12 next year, the date we have chosen for Commencement is Wednesday, June 24th, 2026.

Students used old Sears Catalogs to find consumer goods from yesteryear, then we compared those prices with similar products and prices from today (after applying inflation). What our investigation tells us is that Consumer Goods, especially clothing and electronics, have significantly decreased, it is much cheaper to buy a TV today than back "then". As shown in the image - A 37 inch TV in 1985 would cost \$2497.00 after applying inflation. Today, a similar sized TV costs us \$228.00. The next step is to answer the question "why".

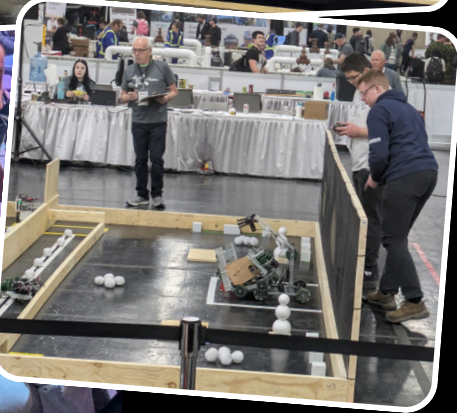
GIRLS EXPLORING TRADES & TECHNOLOGIES

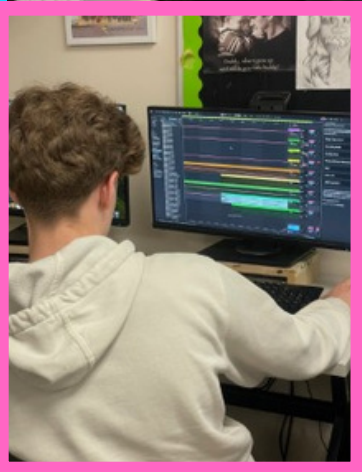
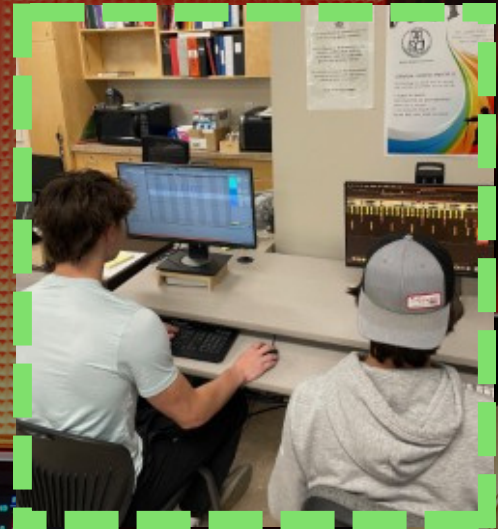

High Quality Learning

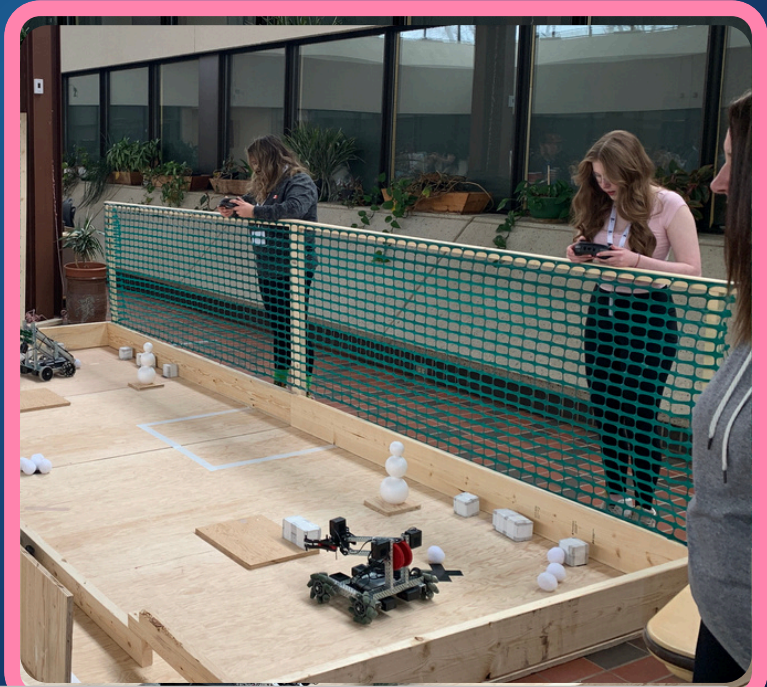

The regional competition held in Fairview at the NWP Campus included six competing students. 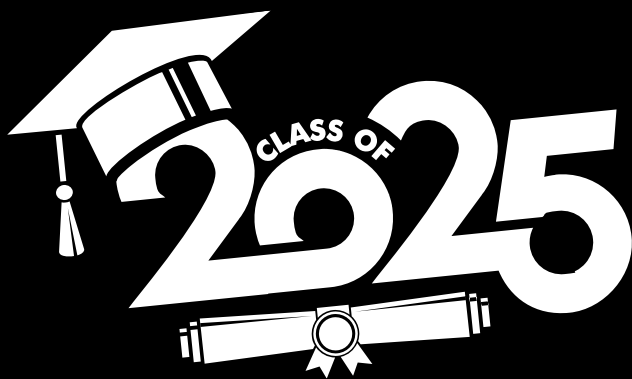




Grad 2025

How much is the Grad fee?

Grad fee for the 2024-2025 year is: **\$135 per student** and must be paid in full (along with any outstanding school fees) before grad in order to participate in the graduation ceremonies.

What is the Grad fee for?

The Grad fee is a charge for each student who participates in grad-related activities to offset the costs. These include the arena rental, decorating, handshake photo, grad cap and gown, sound & lighting and live streaming.

next school year, your child will be unable to receive their textbooks for their courses.

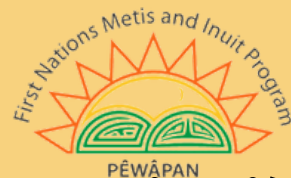
